GOVERNOR OF SPECIAL REGION OF THE CAPITAL OF JAKARTA

Considering: a. whereas based on Minister of Health Decree of Republic of Indonesia Number HK.01.07/MENKES/239/2020 has stipulated large scale social restrictions in the Special Region of Jakarta Province in Order of acceleration of handling Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19);

b. whereas based on considering as referred in point a, need to stipulate Governor Regulation on Implementation of Large-Scale Social Restrictions in Handling of Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Special Region of the Capital of Jakarta Province;

In View of: 1. Law Number 4 of 1984 on Plague of Infectious Diseases (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 1984 Number 20, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 3273);

2. Law Number 29 of 2007 on Special Region of the Capital of Jakarta Government as Capital of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2007 Number 93, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 4744);

3. Law Number 23 of 2014 on Local Government (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2014 Number 244, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 5587), as amended several times, recently by Law Number 9 of 2015 on Second Amendment of Law Number 23 of 2014 on Local

Government (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2015 Number 58, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 5679);

4. Law Number 6 of 2018 on Health Quarantine (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2018 Number 128, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 6236);

5. Government Regulation Number 21 of 2020 on Large Scale Social Restrictions in Order of Acceleration Handling of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2020 Number 91, supplement to the State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Number 6487);

6. Minister of Health Regulation Number 9 of 2020 on Guidelines of Large-Scale Social Restrictions in Order of Acceleration of Handling Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia of 2020 Number 326);

DECIDED:

Stipulate: GOVERNOR REGULATION ON IMPLEMENTATION OF LARGE-SCALE SOCIAL RESTRICTIONS IN HANDLING OF CORONA VIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) IN SPECIAL REGION OF THE CAPITAL OF JAKARTA PROVINCE

CHAPTER I GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

In this Governor Regulation, meant:

1. Large Scale Social Restrictions hereinafter abbreviated as PSBB is restrictions on certain activities of the population in a given area allegedly infected with Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in such a way to prevent possibilities the spread of Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).
2. Basic Goods is goods which concern the lives of many people with high needs scale and become supporting factor for people's welfare.
3. Essential Goods is strategic goods that important role in determining the smooth of national development.

4. Population is every person who has domicile and or activities in Jakarta Province.
5. Employer is each individual of Indonesian citizen or business entity in the form of legal entity or not legal entity established and domiciled in the jurisdiction of the Unitary State of Republic of Indonesia conducting business in the field of Trade.
6. Special Region of the Capital of Jakarta Province hereinafter as DKI Jakarta Province is province that have specificities in the administration of local government due the position as the Capital of the Unitary State of the Republic of Indonesia.
7. Special Region of the Capital of Jakarta Province Government hereinafter as DKI Jakarta Province Government is the Governor and local apparatus of the DKI Jakarta Province as an element of organizing the administration of the DKI Jakarta Province.
8. Governor is the Local Head of the DKI Jakarta Province due his position also a representative Government in DKI Jakarta Province.
9. Local Secretary is DKI Jakarta Province Local Secretary.
10. Local Apparatus is supporting elements of the Governor and the Local House of Representatives in the administration of government affairs which are the jurisdiction of DKI Jakarta Province.
11. DKI Jakarta Province Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) hereinafter as Province COVID-19 Task Force is Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) formed by DKI Jakarta Province Government for Province level.
12. Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) at Administration City/ Administration Region (Kabupaten) level hereinafter as Administration City/Region (Kabupaten) COVID-19 Task Force is Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling Corona Virus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) formed by Administration City/Region (Kabupaten) Government for City/Region (Kabupaten) level.

CHAPTER II PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

Article 2

This Governor Regulation is intended as a guideline for implementing PSBB in order to acceleration of handling Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in DKI Jakarta Province.

Article 3

This Governor Regulation aims to:

- a. restrict certain activities and movements of people and or goods in suppressing the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19);
- b. increase anticipation of the growth of the escalation of the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19);
- c. strengthen health handling efforts due to Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19); and
- d. handle the social and economic impact of the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).

CHAPTER III SCOPE

Article 4

The scope of this Governor Regulation including:

- a. implementation of PSBB;
- b. rights, obligations and fulfilment of basic needs of the population during the PSBB;
- c. resource management for Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19);
- d. monitoring, evaluation, and reporting; and
- e. sanctions.

CHAPTER IV IMPLEMENTATION OF PSBB

Part One
General

Article 5

- (1) In effort to prevent the widespread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19), the Governor imposed PSBB in DKI Jakarta Province.
- (2) PSBB as referred in paragraph (1) carried out in the form of restrictions on outdoor activities carried out by every person who has domicile and or activities in DKI Jakarta Province.
- (3) During the implementation of the PSBB, every person is required:
 - a. implementing of Clean and Healthy Behaviour (PHBS); and
 - b. use a mask outside home.
- (4) The restrictions on outdoor activities in implementation of PSBB as referred in paragraph (2) including:
 - a. implementation of learning in schools and or other educational institutions;
 - b. work activities in the workplace;
 - c. religious activities in worship places;
 - d. activities in places or public facilities;
 - e. social and cultural activities; and
 - f. movement of people and goods using transportation modes.
- (5) Coordination, mobilization of resources and operational implementation of PSBB as referred in paragraph (1) carry out by Province Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling COVID-19.
- (6) The period of implementation of PSBB as referred in paragraph (1) shall be stipulated by Governor Decree.

Part Two
Implementation of Restrictions Learning in Schools and or Educational Institutions

Article 6

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, temporary suspension of activities at schools and or other educational institutions.
- (2) In implementation of the suspension of activities at school as referred in paragraph (1), all learning activities are changed by implementing learning in each home/residence through the distance learning method.
- (3) Activities and school administration activity services carried out from home with a customized form of services.
- (4) The technical implementation and evaluation of learning and school administration services during the implementation of PSBB are further stipulated by the Local Apparatus who responsible in education field.

Article 7

- (1) Other educational institutions which temporary suspended during the implementation of PSBB as referred in Article 6 paragraph (1), including:
 - a. higher education institution;
 - b. training institution;
 - c. research institution;
 - d. coaching institution; and
 - e. similar institution.
- (2) Temporary suspension of activities in other educational institutions as referred in paragraph (1), excluded for educational institutions, training, research related to health services.
- (3) In implementation of the suspension of activities in other educational institutions as referred in paragraph (1), activities, learning and administrative activity services carried out online from home in accordance with technical provisions of the relevant agencies.

Article 8

- (1) In the temporary suspension of activities during the implementation of PSBB, the person in charge of schools and other educational institutions is required:

- a. ensure that the learning process still running and the rights of students to get an education are fulfilled;
 - b. prevent the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the location and school environment and or other educational institutions; and
 - c. maintain the school security and or other educational institutions.
- (2) The efforts to prevent the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID19) in the location and school environment and or other educational institutions as referred in paragraph (1) point b carried out periodically in a way:
- a. clean and disinfect school facilities and infrastructure; and
 - b. implement a protocol to prevent the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) for educators and other education personnel.

Part Three
Restrictions of Work Activities in the Workplace

Article 9

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, temporary suspension of activities in the workplace/office;
- (2) During the suspension of work activities in the workplace/office as referred in paragraph (1), obliged to replace work activities in the workplace with work activities at home/residence;
- (3) Workplace leaders who carried out temporary suspension of work activities in workplace as referred in paragraph (2) are required:
 - a. Keep the services provided and or business activities still running limited;
 - b. keep the employee productivity/performance;
 - c. prevent the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the location and workplace environment;
 - d. keep the location security and environment around the workplace; and
 - e. provide protection to employees who exposed to Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in accordance with statutory provisions.

- (4) The efforts to prevent the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in location and workplace environment as referred in paragraph (3) point c, carried out periodically in a way:
- a. clean the workplace environment;
 - b. disinfecting floors, walls and building equipment in the workplace; and
 - c. close entry access for parties who are not interested.

Article 10

- (1) Excluded from temporary suspension of work activities in the workplace/office as referred in Article 9 paragraph (1), for workplace/office in the category:
- a. all offices/agencies government, both national and regional, based on arrangements from the relevant ministries;
 - b. Foreign countries representative offices and or international organizations in carrying out diplomatic and consular functions and other functions in accordance with international law;
 - c. State/Local Owned Enterprises that participate in handling of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) and or in fulfilling the basic needs of the population following the arrangements of the relevant ministries and or the DKI Jakarta Province Government;
 - d. Employer engaged in the sectors:
 1. Health;
 2. foodstuffs/food/beverage;
 3. energy;
 4. communication and information technology;
 5. finance;
 6. logistic;
 7. hospitality;
 8. construction;
 9. strategic industries;
 10. basic services, public utilities and industry determined as national vital objects and certain objects; and or
 11. daily needs.
 - e. Local and international social organizations engaged in the disaster and or social sector.

- (2) In the term of temporary suspension of work activities in the workplace/office as referred in paragraph (1), the workplace leader obliged to do:
- a. restrictions on interactions in work activities;
 - b. restrictions of every person who has comorbidities and or conditions that can be fatal if exposed to Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) to carry out activities in the workplace, including:
 - 1. sufferers of high blood pressure;
 - 2. sufferers of heart disease;
 - 3. sufferers of diabetes;
 - 4. sufferers of lung disease;
 - 5. sufferers of cancer;
 - 6. pregnant; and
 - 7. more than 60 (sixty) years old.
 - c. implementation of prevention protocol of spread of the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the workplace, including:
 - 1. ensuring that the workplace is always clean and hygienic;
 - 2. has operational cooperation in health protection and prevention of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) with the nearest health service facility for emergency measures;
 - 3. provide vaccines, vitamins and additional nutrients to improve employee immunity;
 - 4. carry out periodic disinfection of floors, walls and building equipment in the workplace;
 - 5. detect and monitor the body temperature of employees who enter the workplace and ensure that employees who work in the workplace are not above normal body temperature or sick;
 - 6. requires washing hand with soap and or hand sanitizer includes providing adequate and easy to access hand washing facilities in the workplace;
 - 7. keep the distance between employees (physical distancing) at least in the range of 1 (one) meter;
 - 8. disseminating information as well as advice/prevention calls for Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) to be disseminated at strategic locations in the workplace; and
 - 9. in the event that an employee in the workplace who is a patient under surveillance, then:

- a) work activities in the workplace should be temporary suspension at least 14 (fourteen) working days;
 - b) medical personnel are assisted by security forces to evacuate and spray disinfectants on all places, facilities and work equipment; and
 - c) the temporary suspension is carried out until the process of evacuation and spraying disinfectants, as well as the implementation of health checks and isolation of employees who have made physical contact with employees exposed to Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) have been completed.
- (3) For food and beverage supply activities, the person in charge of a restaurant/food places/similar business has an obligation to:
- a. restricting services to take away directly, through online ordering, and or by telephone/delivery services;
 - b. keep the queue standing and sitting at least 1 (one) meter between customers;
 - c. implement of food sanitation principle in the process of handling food in accordance with the provisions;
 - d. provide assistive equipment such as gloves and or food tongs to minimize direct contact with ready meals in the preparation, processing and serving process;
 - e. ensure the adequacy of the heating process in food processing according to standards;
 - f. cleaning work areas, facilities and equipment, especially that have a surface in direct contact with food;
 - g. provide washing hand facilities with soap for customers and employees;
 - h. Prohibit working employees who are sick or show above normal body temperature, cough, runny nose, diarrhea and shortness of breath; and
 - i. requires that food handlers use gloves, head masks and work clothes in accordance with occupational safety and health guidelines.
- (4) For hospitality activities, the person in charge of the hotel is required:
- a. provides special services for guests who want to self-isolation;
 - b. restrict the guests to only be active in hotel rooms by utilizing room service;
 - c. negate the activities and or close hotel service facilities which may make a crowd in the hotel area;

- d. Prohibit guests who are sick or show above normal body temperature, cough, runny nose, diarrhea and shortness of breath to enter the hotel; and
 - e. require employees to wear masks, gloves and work clothes in accordance with occupational safety and health guidelines.
- (5) For construction activities, the workplace leader has obligations with the following conditions:
- a. Ongoing construction activities may be carried out by restrict the employees activities to only in the project area; and
 - b. The owner and or construction work service provider required:
 - 1. appoint the person in charge for implementing Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) prevention in the project area;
 - 2. restrict the activities and interactions of employees to only carried out in the project area;
 - 3. provide shelter and daily necessities for all employee while in the project area;
 - 4. provide health space in the workplace which equipped with adequate health facilities;
 - 5. prohibits anyone, both employees and guests, who have above normal body temperature from being inside the work site;
 - 6. convey explanations, suggestions, campaigns, promotion of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) prevention techniques in every morning K3 counselling activity or safety morning talk; and
 - 7. carry out the regular monitoring of the health of employees while in the project area.
- (6) Province Chairman of Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling COVID-19 may add workplace/office category that excluded from the temporary suspension of work activities as referred in paragraph (1).

Part Four
Restrictions of Religious Activities in Worship Places

Article 11

- (1) During the implementation of the PSBB, temporary suspension of religious activities in worship places and or in certain place.
- (2) During the temporary suspension of religious activities at worship places and or in certain place as referred in paragraph (1), religious activities are carried out at each home.
- (3) During the temporary suspension of religious activities at worship places and or in certain places as referred in paragraph (1), the time marking worship activities such as adzan (call to prayer), bells, and or other time markers are carried out as usual.

Article 12

- (1) During the implementation of the PSBB, the person in charge of the worship places are mandatory:
 - a. provide education or understanding to each congregation to keep doing religious activities at home;
 - b. implement prevention the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in their worship places; and
 - c. maintain the security of each worship places.
- (2) The efforts to prevent the spread of Corona Virus Disease (COVID19) in worship places as referred in paragraph (1) point b carried out periodically by:
 - a. cleaning worship places and the surrounding environment;
 - b. disinfect on floors, walls and building equipment worship places; and
 - c. close entry access for parties who do not have an interest.

Part Five

Restrictions of Activities in Places or Public Facilities

Article 13

- (1) During the implementation of the PSBB, population are prohibited from carrying out activities with more than 5 (five) people in places or public facilities.

- (2) Management of places or public facilities should close temporary places or public facilities for population activities during the implementation of PSBB.
- (3) Excluded from prohibition of activities on places or public facilities as referred in paragraph (1), population activities for:
 - a. fulfils basic needs and or daily needs; and
 - b. self-sports activities.
- (4) Province Chairman of Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling COVID-19 may add categories of population activities which excluded from the prohibition of activities on the places or public facilities as referred in paragraph (3).

Article 14

- (1) Fulfilment of basic needs as referred in Article 13 paragraph (3) point a, includes the activity of providing, processing, distribution and or shipping:
 - a. foodstuffs/food/beverages;
 - b. energy;
 - c. communication and information technology;
 - d. finance, banks and payment system; and or
 - e. logistic.
- (2) Fulfilment of daily needs as referred in Article 13 paragraph (3) point a, including:
 - a. Retail goods supply in:
 - 1. traditional market;
 - 2. convenience store, mini-markets, supermarkets, hypermarkets, grocery stores and specialty stores both on their own and in shopping centres; or
 - 3. grocery store/stall.
 - b. laundry.
- (3) In serving the population needs during the implementation of PSBB as referred in paragraph (1) and paragraph (2), employer should follow the provisions of restriction activities as follows:
 - a. prioritizing online and or long-distance ordering of goods with delivery service facilities;

- b. helped to maintain economic stability and purchasing power consumer goods by not increasing the price of goods;
- c. disinfection regularly on business places;
- d. detect and monitor employee body temperature and consumers who enter the market/shop as well ensure that employees are not working have a slight fever or illness;
- e. implementation of distance restrictions between consumers (physical distancing) that entered to markets/shops at least in the range of 1 (one) meter;
- f. requires every employee to wear clothes work in accordance with occupational safety and health guidelines; and
- g. implement of hand washing recommendations with soap and or hand sanitizer include providing adequate hand washing facilities and easily accessible by consumers and employees.

Article 15

- (1) Self-sports activities as referred in Article 13 paragraph (3) point b, may be carried out limited by population outside the home during the implementation of the.
- (2) Self-sports activities as referred in paragraph (1), may allowed with the provisions:
 - a. carry out independently and not in groups; and
 - b. limited to the area around the living house

Part Six

Restrictions of Social and Culture Activities

Article 16

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, a temporary suspension for the social and cultural activities that arise a crowd of people.
- (2) Social and cultural activities as referred in paragraph (1) also include activities related to associations or meetings:
 - a. politic;
 - b. sports
 - c. entertainment;
 - d. academic; and
 - e. culture

Article 17

- (1) Excluded from termination of social and culture activities as referred in Article 16 paragraph (1), for activities:
 - a. circumcision;
 - b. wedding;
 - c. funeral and or takziah (condolence) are not due Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).

- (2) The implementation of circumcision activities as referred in paragraph (1) point a, implement with the provisions:
 - a. implemented in health care facilities;
 - b. attended by limited circles;
 - c. exclude celebratory events that invite crowds; and
 - d. keep distance between attended parties (physical distancing) at least in the range of 1 (one) meter.

- (3) The implementation of wedding activities as referred in paragraph (1) point b, implement with the provisions:
 - a. implemented at the KUA (Religious Affairs Office) and or the Civil Registry Office;
 - b. attended by limited circles;
 - c. exclude celebratory events that invite crowds; and
 - d. keep distance between attended parties (physical distancing) at least in the range of 1 (one) meter.

- (4) The implementation of funeral and or takziah (condolence) activities are not due Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) as referred in paragraph (1) point c, implement with the provisions:
 - a. implemented at funeral house
 - b. attended by limited circles; and
 - c. keep distance between attended parties (physical distancing) at least in the range of 1 (one) meter.

- (5) Province Chairman of Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling COVID-19 may add categories of population activities which excluded from the termination of social and culture activities as referred in paragraph (1).

Part Seven
Restrictions on Using Transportation Modes
For the Movement of People and Goods

Article 18

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, all movement activities people and or goods are temporary suspended, except for:
 - a. fulfilling basic needs; and
 - b. activities that may allowed during the implementation of PSBB.
- (2) Excluded from temporary suspended activities for people movement as referred in paragraph (1), for type of transportation modes:
 - a. private motorcycle;
 - b. public transportation by motorcycles; and
 - c. train transportation.
- (3) Excluded from temporary suspended activities for goods movement as referred in paragraph (1), for all type of transportation modes.
- (4) Private passenger vehicle users are required to follow the following conditions:
 - a. use for only to fulfil basic needs and or other activities that may allowed during PSBB;
 - b. disinfect vehicle after use;
 - c. use a mask in the vehicle;
 - d. limit the maximum number of people is 50% (fifty percent) of vehicle capacity; and
 - e. not driving if above normal body temperature or sick.
- (5) Private motorcycle vehicle user is required to follow the following conditions:
 - a. use for only to fulfil basic needs and or other activities that may allowed during PSBB;
 - b. disinfect vehicle after use;
 - c. use a mask and gloves; and
 - d. not riding if above normal body temperature or sick.

- (6) Two wheeled transportation based on application is restricted to use only for the carriage of goods.
- (7) People transportation by public vehicles, rail transport, and or transportation modes of goods are required to follow the following conditions:
 - a. limit the maximum number of people is 50% (fifty percent) of transportation capacity;
 - b. limit the operational hours in according to regulation from DKI Jakarta Province Government and or related institutions;
 - c. disinfect regularly all of transportation mode used;
 - d. detect and monitor officers and passengers body temperature that using the transportation modes.
- (8) Province Chairman of the Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling COVID-19 may add transportation modes which excluded from temporary stopping of transportation modes for the movement of people and or goods as referred in paragraph (2) and paragraph (3).

CHAPTER V
RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS AS WELL AS FULFILLMENT OF POPULATION BASIC
NEEDS DURING PSBB

Part One
Right and Obligation

Article 19

- (1) During the implementation of the PSBB, every population in DKI Jakarta Province has the same rights to:
 - a. obtain treatment and services from the DKI Jakarta Province Government;
 - b. obtain basic health services according to medical needs;
 - c. obtain data and information public about Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19);
 - d. easy access in making complaints about Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19); and
 - e. funeral and mortuary services on corpse of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) and or suspected Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).

- (2) The implementation of fulfilling the rights as referred in paragraph (1) follows the technical guidelines stipulated by the Province Chairman of Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling COVID-19.

Article 20

- (1) During the implementation of PSBB, every population in DKI Jakarta Province mandatory:
- a. comply with all provisions in the event of implementation of the PSBB;
 - b. participate in the implementation of the PSBB; and
 - c. implementing clean and healthy behaviour (PHBS).
- (2) In the events of handling Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19), each population obliged:
- a. follow the testing and examination of samples for Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in epidemiological investigations (contact tracing) if it has been determined for inspection by officers;
 - b. carry out self-isolation in the residence and or shelter and hospital treatment according to health personnel recommendations; and
 - c. report to health personnel if themselves and or their families are exposed to Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).
- (3) The implementation of obligation as referred in paragraph (2) should follow the technical guidelines stipulated by Province Chairman of Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling COVID-19.

Part Two

Fulfilment of Population Basic Needs During PSBB

Article 21

- (1) The DKI Jakarta Province Government may provide assistance social for vulnerable population who affected in fulfilling their basic needs during the implementation of the PSBB.
- (2) Social assistance as referred in paragraph (1) is provided in the form of basic materials and or others direct assistance

which distribution mechanism in accordance with statutory provisions.

- (3) Determination of recipients of social assistance as referred in paragraph (2) shall be determined by a Governor Decree.

Article 22

- (1) The DKI Jakarta Province Government may provide incentives to Employer who affected by the implementation of PSBB.
- (2) Incentives as referred in paragraph (1) are given in the form of:
 - a. reduction of local taxes and retribution for employer;
 - b. providing social assistance to employees who affected by the implementation of the PSBB; and or
 - c. other assistance in accordance with the statutory provisions.

CHAPTER VI RESOURCES FOR HANDLING CORONA VIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19)

Article 23

- (1) In order to carry out the handling and management of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) in the DKI Jakarta Province, the DKI Jakarta Province Government compiles a database and information on the needs of the supply and distribution of resources.
- (2) The procedure and use of the information systems in order to supply and distribution of resources as referred in paragraph (1) stipulated by Province Chairman of Task Force for the Acceleration of Handling COVID-19.

Article 24

- (1) The DKI Jakarta Province Government may carry out institutional collaboration in implementing of PSBB with various parties in accordance with statutory provisions.

- (2) Institutional collaboration as referred to in paragraph (1) stipulated in the form of:
- a. human resources support;
 - b. facilities and infrastructure;
 - c. data and information;
 - d. other services and or support.

CHAPTER VII
MONITORING, EVALUTION AND REPORTING

Article 25

- (1) Monitoring and evaluation of the implementation of PSBB carried out in order to assess the success of the implementation of PSBB in breaking the chain of transmission of Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19).
- (2) Monitoring and evaluation as referred in paragraph (1) carried out by COVID-19 Task Force according to regional level through monitoring or inspection to the field in accordance with the authority and responsibility.
- (3) Assessment of the successful implementation of the PSBB as referred in paragraph (1) based on criteria:
- a. implementation of PSBB in accordance with this Governor Regulation;
 - b. number of cases; and
 - c. case distribution.

Article 26

- (1) In implementation of the PSBB, the society, Rukun Tetangga (neighbourhood association) and Rukun Warga (community association) actively participated in monitoring the implementation of the PSBB.
- (2) Monitoring implementation of PSBB as referred in paragraph (1) reported through the channel for handling public complaints owned by the DKI Jakarta Province Government.

- (3) The results of reporting by the society as referred in paragraph (2) will be followed up by the regional level COVID-19 Task Force in accordance with the authorities and responsibilities.

CHAPTER VII
SANCTION

Article 27

Violations of the implementation of PSBB are subject to sanctions in accordance with statutory provisions, including criminal sanctions

CHAPTER VIII
CLOSING PROVISIONS

Article 28

This Governor Regulation valid from the date of stipulation
