

## Please join us for a Maritime Skills Commission webinar discussing The Indonesia Opportunity

Maritime UK and the Department for Transport have established a Maritime Skills Commission to lead the sector's work in ensuring the maritime sector has a pipeline of talented people to serve all parts of the sector - covering shipping, ports, leisure marine, engineering, science and professional services.

The Maritime Minister set the Commission seven objectives, one of which was to increase exports of maritime education and training. Since then we have been working with industry, training providers and the Department of International Trade through webinars and Directory.

In May 2021 the Commission was invited to attend a high level policy exchange with the Indonesian Government to discuss the Skills for Prosperity programme and ways to share ideas and experience. The Commission is keen to continue collaborating with Indonesia on our objective and this webinar will provide an opportunity to share, to learn and to identify any obstacles which need to be addressed.

## **FORMAT**

The webinar will explore existing UK and Indonesia partnerships in maritime education and training to help show the scale and nature of the opportunity, and discuss how to help build more partnerships with Indonesia.

We will hear from the City of Glasgow College about its experience in Indonesia, from the Department for International Trade representatives based in Indonesia, and [we hope] from the Indonesian Ministry for Transport.
