

## Message from The British Ambassador to Indonesia and Timor-Leste



2023 is another major year for British business interest in Indonesia. The country's profile remains high, as economic growth and stability continue, and as the country transitions from its high-profile role as G20 Chair in 2022 to ASEAN Chair. Infrastructure, education, energy security and economic development

are still among Indonesia's key priorities, and the UK is delighted to support Indonesia and ASEAN in achieving those priorities.

Last year saw a number of highlights on the trade and investment front, including the first meeting of the Joint Economic and Trade Committee (JETCO). Through working groups on clean growth and agriculture/food and drink, we aim to address market access barriers and promote mutually beneficial trade within the sectors.

In October 2022, we also signed a bilateral investment promotion MoU with Indonesia's Minister of Investment, aimed at encouraging two-way investment in the priority sectors of value-added minerals, life sciences, and energy transition. We have a particular focus on developing collaboration within electric vehicle supply chains, including sustainable mining. We are also pleased to support the Indonesia Just Energy Transition Partnership, including through a \$1bn World Bank Loan Guarantee.

The establishment of JETCO and the investment in MoU show our ambition to expand further our £3.5 billion trade relationship with Southeast Asia's

biggest economy. Indonesia is an important partner in the region with so much potential in its growing middle class, growing consumers of everything from food and drink to education and technology.

We have also stepped up our promotion of the UK's position as a superpower in science and technology. We held the very first UK-Southeast Asia Tech Week in March this year, bringing 14 cutting-edge UK companies to Jakarta and Bangkok, with innovative solutions in Smart Cities and Net Zero. The Tech Week is a launchpad for engaging further with the ASEAN tech ecosystem and opening the market for UK tech companies to invest and expand in this region. We expect to see a strong tech delegation at London Tech Week in June.

BritCham is an important partner across this ambitious agenda and beyond, with members working to provide solutions to the world's greatest challenges such as sustainability, digitalisation, and talent development. BritCham's commitment to helping ensure UK businesses thrive in Indonesia is wholly in line with the Embassy's work to grow the UK's presence in Indonesia and the region.

While large UK firms are expanding their businesses in Indonesia, we also see growing interest from small and medium enterprises (SMEs). We are pleased that BritCham plays a significant role in facilitating market entry to those UK entities.

The UK has recently brought together the previously separate parts of government dealing with business and with international trade, signalling our determination to work closely with industries across all aspects. The Department for Business and Trade (DBT) is keen to support British businesses in the UK and overseas, including in Indonesia, and I encourage all BritCham members to speak to our team, where you see opportunities to support each other.

I look forward to seeing the UK-Indonesia trade relationship grow still further and to working closely with BritCham to achieve our common goals.

### ■ Message from The Honorary Treasurer



The attached extracts from the audited financial statements of the Chamber are to inform Members of the financial position of the Chamber at the end of 2022.

A copy of the full set of annual audited financial statements will be provided to any member on application to the Chamber's Executive Director. The following is a summary of the key metrics. A

briefer version of the below has been presented verbally to the attendees at the AGM.

### ■ Performance Summary

#### Deficit

In 2022, the Chamber generated a deficit, after tax, of IDR 408.8 million. This represents a decrease of IDR 476 million versus 2021 results. Primarily caused by the loss of the grant from the UK government on the revenue side, this was offset by higher membership revenues, improvements in the net results from events and media, and higher operational costs from strategy and promotional costs, which are hoped may be seen as investments that will bear fruit in later years.

#### Revenue

Overall revenues increased by IDR 1,03 million, or almost 18%, during 2022.

Membership subscriptions and special sponsorships increased by 8%. The return of in-person events, particularly the BiSEA conference, Christmas party, and sponsorship of the PWG, contributed to significant increase in events revenue and an additional IDR 222m or 270% increase in net contribution from events. Higher surpluses from the AGM and GBBI handbook also assisted. Education Centre returns increased compared to

2021, but there are still some COVID-19 related lags. Thus, the Education Centre is not yet break even.

#### Costs

As in previous years, with the tight budgetary constraints the Chamber is required to operate within, cost control remains a key priority – ensuring we optimise the use of our financial resources for the benefit of members whilst remaining within budget and not exposing the Chamber to any significant financial risks.

However, with the loss of the OBN Grant, additional new strategies and new directions are required and added costs incurred in determining these and setting out the plans for the future. In 2022, total costs, not directly attributable to revenue streams, increased by 11% or IDR 151 million, mainly due to these strategic issues. The net cost of the Education Centre is expected to be short-term, and this will become a significant revenue stream.

#### Taxation

The 2022 corporate taxation return has been completed, reviewed (including an independent review by an external tax consultant), and submitted within the DGT deadlines.

#### Balance Sheet

The balance sheet position remains sound following several years of good performance and strong financial management. As of 31 December 2022, liquid assets stood at IDR 3.1 billion, and net assets were at IDR 1.5 billion.

As reported in the previous year, the loss of the OBN grant has led to the need for alternative income generation and pending any long-term guarantee of additional revenues management – determined that it is prudent to continue to retain a reserve sufficient to cover the cost of satisfying any existing HR and other commitments (six-month period). This amount remains at IDR 1.8 billion.

#### Summary

Despite the significant challenges from the loss of the OBN grant and the delaying effect of COVID-19 on the Education Centre revenues, the continuing support of members and sponsors and the prudent stewardship shown by the Executive Office team means that the financial condition of the Chamber remains sound. We remain challenged to encourage greater financial commitment from members. We shall continue to be sufficiently agile to take on new revenue opportunities. However, as in previous years, we will continue to exercise robust control over its finances to ensure resources are optimised and focused on the right areas for the benefit of our members and that we operate in a financially sustainable manner.

I would again like to express my thanks to the members and sponsors who supported BritCham during 2022 and especially to Chris Wren and the team at the Executive Office, who have again shown that they can adapt to the challenges presented and have kept the overall position and prospects in good order.

I would also like to thank Chairman Pak Donny and the rest of the Board for the opportunity and support. Additionally, I would like to send out a special thanks and mention to Lia, the finance manager, and Chris for their excellent stewardship and governance and for being able to respond with clear explanations to any queries.

Indonesia has the honour of being the first location globally, outside the UK, to have full-time on the ground representation, with the appointment in December 2017 of Richard Michael as Country Head. This move demonstrates the importance the UK government attaches to the development of stronger trade and investment flows between the UK and Indonesia. The available capacity for Indonesia was increased, in 2020, to £4 billion.

UKEF can consider support for Indonesian buyers of goods and services, provided that at least 20% of the imported content is sourced from the UK. UKEF is able to offer extended terms of finance in a range of currencies, including Indonesian Rupiah.

# Climate Change & the Environment

Chairman: Jeffrey L. Chatellier - CEO of Forest Carbon



As global commitment to tackling climate change continued to grow in 2022, Indonesia played a prominent role in climate discussions when it hosted the G20 nations in Bali. During the event, Indonesia pledged to phase out coal energy and invest in renewable energy infrastructure, supported by a \$20 billion package of public and private finance – the largest single emissions reduction deal to date.

Indonesia's participation was timely, coinciding with COP27 in Egypt, where leading nations recommitted to limiting global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels. A significant development at COP27 was recognition of the real impacts of climate change on vulnerable countries and the establishment of a "Loss and Damage" fund to provide financial assistance to such countries. With the estimated cost of climate change exceeding \$227 billion during 2022, discussions on the roles of public and private sectors in addressing this issue are expected to intensify. For Indonesia, COP27 brought particular importance as it officially acknowledged "natural climate solutions" (which focus on forest conservation and restoration) as key strategies, indicating that Indonesia is emerging as a potential climate leader.

Achieving Indonesia's climate goals will require substantial investment from foreign and domestic private sectors. To facilitate this, a Presidential Decree on "Carbon Economic Value" was issued in 2022 and recently the Ministry of Finance and the Financial Services Authority (OJK) have assumed increasingly significant roles in designing systems and providing guidance for the operationalization of carbon regulations. These steps and others have instilled confidence in the business community that international carbon trading and related carbon infrastructure will soon be functional in Indonesia.

Indonesia has committed to achieving a net-zero energy sector by 2050 primarily relying on decommissioning coal-fired power plants and

promoting the adoption of green energy and electric vehicles (EVs). Incentives and subsidies have been implemented, and Presidential Instruction No. 7 of 2022 mandates state firms to update their fleets with EVs. With the world's largest nickel reserves, Indonesia's domestic nickel supply will play a crucial role in establishing an EV value chain. With a substantial portion of those reserves located under forested lands, it is imperative that members ensure that energy transitions leverage sustainable supply chains that align with net-zero and no-deforestation commitments.

The Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KADIN) has taken an active role in supporting businesses to meet climate commitments with its Net-Zero hub, a platform that provides climate-smart business quidance and carbon foot printing for its members.

The group focuses on four core areas:

- · Carbon Taxation and Green Finance
- Renewable Energy/Carbon Capture
- Natural Climate Solutions (Forest Restoration and Conservation)
- Human Capital Development for Sustainability Professionals

The group works on the following:

- Climate change related advocacy with Indonesian stakeholders including but not limited to Government and Indonesian business associations such as KADIN.
- Enhancing corporate climate change awareness by bringing best in practice climate change and sustainability practices to the attention of our membership.
- Building awareness of both UK technologies and UK financing support that can add value to Indonesia's climate change targets.

# Human Capital & Education

To add value for members, BritCham Focus Groups are designed to address contemporary and future focussed issues that have immediate appeal and utility for different sectors. The Human Capital and Education Members Group (HC&E) has continued to grow, noting its increasing importance for guiding learning and training connected to the implementation of career, business, community, and environmental sustainability.

Based on the BritCham Business Confidence Index results, the acquisition, development and retention of leadership, professional and technical talent is cited as a major challenge to realising business potential alongside Indonesia nation building.

As Indonesia seeks to leverage its developing global potential, multiple opportunities prevail for managerial and employee Continuing Professional Development. The recent emergence of hybrid and online learning delivery enhances these opportunities for British service providers. This group will therefore make a vital contribution to simultaneously enlarging the talent pool for both Indonesian and UK enterprises.

The HC&E Member Focus Group works closely with the BritCham Education Centre in achieving this objective. More engagement with UK alumni, relevant employer associations and educational institutions are planned, including partnerships with companies and government organisations in Indonesia for internships and the employment of returning Indonesian talent from the UK.

The Group will also provide thought leadership to boards, senior leadership teams and human resources practitioners in our wider membership, together with policy development at national level, particularly through sustainability leadership training and ESG (Environmental, Social & Governance) culture development. Our first ever book publication in 2023, '12 Leadership Practices to Sustain Livelihoods and Life' is testament to this strategy.



# Technology & Digitalisation

In terms of what's on offer, Indonesia currently has one of the highest rates of internet usage in Asia with over 212 million regular users as of January this year, or 77% of the population. Indonesia is also home to 167 million social media users, over 60% of the population, and has more than 350 million active smartphone connections – a figure that exceeds 100% of the population! E-commerce platforms are growing in scope and scale, and government services are now increasingly delivered online and via smartphone apps.

But the Focus Group will also work on the challenges and risks posed by this rapid transformation. These range from data privacy and protection, on which there is an ongoing discourse with the government, to discussion on the cross-border traffic in data and the prevention of fraud. The Focus Group will also review, for example, the emerging regulatory environment for internet service companies, the registration and taxation of entities, and any restrictions on their activities.



## ■ Agriculture, Food & Beverage

Since its establishment in 2013, the Agriculture, Food, and Beverages Working Group (WG) has expanded thanks to the participation of its member businesses, which include those engaged in the production of processed foods, beverages, horticulture, and dairy. This working group (WG) addresses a wide range of topics related to the food supply chain and seeks to play a role in fostering the constructive and proactive discourse that is necessary to create a shared strategy for attaining objectives related to food security, economic opportunity, as well as environmental sustainability.

The regulation of SNI, risk-based licensing for alcoholic beverages, the carbon tax plan, the proposal to impose an excise on sweetened bottled packaged products, Halal, commodity balance, foot and mouth disease, and other topics were discussed at the working group meeting in 2022. Additionally, the working group wrote letters to the governments (Coordinating Ministry for Economic Affairs, Head of BPJPH, and BKPM) requesting meetings to discuss a number of topics, including the implementation of SNI policy, import substitution policy, commodity balance, Halal, and the effects of online single submission-risk based analysis on the alcoholic industries.



## Automotive

The Automotive Working Group was established in 2009 and consists of major European automotive companies operating in Indonesia. More than 20 companies are active participants, across car and motorcycle manufacturers, spare parts and component producers, certification providers, and consultants.

Through advocacy activities, the Working Group regularly provides recommendations for the improvement of the business and investment climate in Indonesia. The Working Group conducted a series of internal meetings as well as policy meetings with various stakeholders and policymakers. In 2022, the Automotive Working Group engaged with government stakeholders including the Ministry of Transportation, the Ministry of Industry, as well as the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources. The Working Group also held a policy dialogue jointly with GPQI, inviting the Center for the Formulation, Implementation, and Enforcement of Industrial Standardization (Pusat Perumusan, penerapan, dan Pemberlakuan Standardisasi Industri – PPPPSI), Ministry of Industry, to socialize the SNI Certification process.

The Automotive Working Group monitored and advocated for the development of various policies in the sector. Topics covered, among others, include the implementation of the Indonesian National Standard (SNI), the Commodity Balance mechanism, Biofuel and Euro IV emission standards, as well as sustainable development aspects.











## Chemical

The EuroCham Chemical Working Group comprise of world-class chemical companies that operate and invest in Indonesia. The Working Group promotes an open and constructive dialogue with policymakers within the Indonesia Government, as well as with relevant stakeholders in the chemical sector, in order to continuously explore possibilities for further improvement. The ultimate aim is to enhance Indonesia's competitiveness as an investment destination.

## Energy

EuroCham Energy Working Group consists of the leading European energy companies that are active in Indonesia. The group's mission is to improve understanding between Indonesian and European stakeholders, as well as to engage with and assist all interested stakeholders. The group intends to become a key dialogue partner for Indonesian ministries as part of an overall effort to stimulate European investments within the energy sector.

The group represents the multinational companies in the Energy sector that have been present in Indonesia for many decades. Currently, the group consists of Energy Working Group hosts around 97 companies and 13 embassies with the overall database of the group itself having expanded to more than 300 contacts listed.

Energy Working Group has successfully maintained its regular monthly meetings, conveying through an online platform as well as offline by engaging various speakers and stakeholders to share updates on the relevant issues including renewable energy, energy efficiency, and electricity tariffs. The Group closely monitors policy developments on the cap-and-trade system for coal power plants, carbon tax, captive solar rooftops, and net metering frameworks.

In 2022, the Working Group activities held internal meetings and policy meetings to discuss policy developments that are of relevance in the sector. The Working Group initiated the formulation of joint recommendations for renewable energy and energy efficiency with the government and various stakeholders, while following up for further initiatives to identify how industries could support the achievement of the national renewable energy target and its energy efficiency savings target.

## ■ Finance, Tax & Investment

The Finance, Tax & Investment Working Group was founded to address the general tax and investment policy challenges of EuroCham Indonesia members. The EuroCham Tax, Finance, and Investment Working Group focuses on cross-sectoral issues that have a direct impact on all European firms investing in Indonesia through various kinds of advocacy efforts with the relevant stakeholders.

In order to further improve the business environment and the investment environment in Indonesia, the Working Group encourages open and constructive discussion and frequently makes recommendations on tax, finance, and investment topics to the relevant policy makers. The ultimate objective of these initiatives is to strengthen trade and investment relations in order to support Indonesia's economic development.

The Working Group convened with all of its member companies in 2022 to discuss updates on various policies. The Ministry of Finance, the Financial Services Authority, and the Directorate General of Tax were some of the organizations that the Finance, Tax, and Investment Working Group engaged with in 2022. The harmonization of tax regulations, the financial outlook, the economic recovery, and various taxation policies. The Working Group also jointly worked together with other foreign chambers to address common taxation issues.

## Human Resources

After transforming from a member forum into a working group format in 2019, the Human Resources Working Group pursued activities aimed at becoming more active to discuss issues related to the manpower sector. In order to get better understanding from these regulations, the Working Group conducted a number of advocacy activities, among others: conducted a joint advocacy with other foreign chambers and held a policy meeting with the Ministry of Manpower on foreign workers job position list. In 2022, the government stipulated a Government Regulation in Lieu of Law (Perppu) to amend Law No. 11/2020 on Job Creation as mandated by the Constitutional Court, where some manpower-related provisions are amended and continue setting priority issues within this working group.

## ■ Import-Export Procedures


The EuroCham Import-Export Procedures Working Group consists of established European companies in Indonesia, including some of the world's largest producers and manufacturers, which are also undertaking import- export activities in order to support their businesses. This year, the Working Group pursues active participation in developing policy frameworks related to import-export procedures. Such efforts are made through a number of policy meetings and providing recommendation letters to relevant government institutions. The Working Group activities in 2022, including various interrelations with stakeholders as follows: the Ministry of Trade, the Ministry of Industry, LNSW, and the Ministry of Agriculture.

The Working Group also meets on a regular basis and holds virtual meetings or webinars to allow member companies to exchange updates and deliver input related to a variety of problems affecting cross-border trade procedures. The overall activities are focused on enhancing the conduciveness of business climate in Indonesia, and increasing Indonesia's competitiveness as an investment destination.

Topics covered by the Working Groups in 2022 were Market Access Opportunity, Veterinary Control Number, Commodity Balance, Indonesia National Standard, Post Border Supervision and Simplification of Import License, Indonesia National Single Window, and Import Provision and Policy of various products (iron and steel, textile, footwear, alcoholic beverages, dairy and its derivatives, complementary goods, goods for market test, and after- sales).

## Intellectual Property

The Intellectual Property (IP) Working Group was established in 2006 and represents various companies and stakeholders. The Working Group focuses on crucial issues of intellectual property protection and enforcement. The Group hosts 32 members from 32 companies, 11 law firms and consultancies, 7 embassies and 2 trade agencies, consisting of European business players who embodied innovations in their business DNA.

The IP Working Group activities seek to promote the importance of IP protection for the business and investment environment. To promote this, the Working Group conducted a policy meeting with stakeholders and policy makers. In 2021, the IP Working Group organized a hybrid policy meeting with the Directorate of Investigation and Dispute Settlement of the Directorate General of Intellectual Property to discuss the enforcement of IP in e-commerce.

Overall in 2022, topics discussed include the protection of IP in commerce, the draft patent law prioritized to be legislated in 2023, IP border protection, Patent registration and second medical use, as well as bad faith trademark registration.


## ■ Pharmaceutical & Medical Technology

The Working Group consists of world leading industry players in the pharmaceutical, medical device and healthcare providers sector, active in Indonesia. The Group's mission is to improve the understanding between Indonesian and European stakeholders as well as to engage with and assist all interested stakeholders. The group intends to become a key dialogue partner for Indonesian relevant ministries and institutions in the effort to stimulate European investments in these sectors.

The Group represents the multinational pharmaceutical and medical devices companies that are present in Indonesia for many decades. Currently, the Group consists of 67 members from 41 Companies, 13 consulting and law firms, 9 embassies and 4 business chambers/trade agencies, both from the pharmaceutical and medical devices sector, as well as other supporting industries.

In 2022, the Working Group activities held internal meetings and policy meetings to discuss policy developments that are of relevance in the sector. The Working Group held a policy meeting with the Center for Increasing Use of Domestic Products (P3DN), Ministry of Industry, and the Deputy for Strategic Investment, Coordinating Ministry of Maritime Affairs & Investment, to discuss the topic of Local Content Requirements and the Freezing of imported products in the e-catalogue procurement system.

The Working Group actively advocates issues related to the availability and accessibility of innovative medicines and quality medical technology for Indonesian patients within the Universal Healthcare Coverage (Jaminan Kesehatan Nasional) implemented since 2014. The Group closely monitors policy developments to boost the healthcare industry including halal certification, patent protection, as well as medical tourism.

## Retail

The Retail Working Group was formed to serve as a platform to consolidate the interests of European retailers operating in Indonesia by exchanging information on updates on the regulatory environment, market condition, as well as updates on the development of the industry in general. This year, Retail activities sector in Indonesia was still struggling due to the COVID-19 pandemic. At the same time, the challenges faced by the industry also continue to grow.

To start the year the group held the meeting to discuss on the specific issues based on the sector, which was safeguard measures investigation, the implementation of the Minister of Trade Regulation No. 68/2020 on Import Provisions for Footwear, Electronics, and two- and three-wheeled bicycles, the implementing regulations of Law No. 11/2020 on Job Creation.

Looking at the progress as well as the business environment for this sector, wherein retail is now more into online platforms and no longer brick and mortar stores, the policy and regulations is also increasingly more integrated with digital and e-commerce. Therefore, the Group is sometimes working together with other Working Groups like Import-Export Procedures Working Group that cater mostly to issues faced by retail companies.

## ■ Sustainable Development

Formed in 2014, the Sustainable Development Working Group has been actively conducting meetings to provide a platform whereby EuroCham members can share their experiences regarding their best practices and discuss updates on regulations related to Company Social Responsibility (CSR) and Sustainable Development.

Following the success of the first and second edition of the report, EuroCham launched the 3rd EuroCham Contribution to SDGs Reports. The Report showcased business stakeholders' contribution towards the 17 SDGs Agenda in attaining inclusive economic growth, social development, environmental protection, and the eradication of poverty in hopes to inspire and influence businesses to take immediate actions to build a sustainable business in Indonesia.

This year, EuroCham co-hosted the B20 Sustainability Award 4.0 with the Indonesian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KADIN), which was led by Swiss Chambers of Commerce (SwissCham). The event represented both SMEs and Corporates to exhibit their commitments and contribution towards promoting sustainable development in their respective businesses by pioneering innovative ideas.

Moreover, the Group also invited Indonesia Recovery Packaging Organization (IRO) to give in-depth insights on the waste management for plastic packaging and its impact on the circular economy.

## Technology

Since its establishment in 2019, the EuroCham Technology Working Group has been dedicated to investigating emerging technologies and their potential effects on businesses and industries. The group consists of specialists from various fields, including Information and Technology, innovation, and Research & Development. Despite being relatively new, the working group has been actively involved in supporting the government's efforts to improve the regulatory framework and investment technology.

The Working Group aims to aid the progress of Indonesia and remains actively involved in providing constructive feedback and suggestions to the government on ICT policy development. The activities comprise a range of internal and policy meetings with various stakeholders, including policymakers. To strengthen its position and amplify its advocacy efforts to the public, the Working Group also organizes events that welcome non-members from relevant industry players.

One of the most notable events in 2022 was the Data Protection Dialogue with the Ministry of Communication and Informatics as part of initiatives to welcome the development of the Personal Data Protection Law in Indonesia, which was supported by S. ASEAN International Advocacy & Consultancy (SAIAC). The focus of the event was on how the Personal Data Protection Law can affect the way data is transferred and processed in the private sector, in order to increase consumer confidence and protect their rights to privacy and security.



## ■ Tobacco

The Tobacco Working Group was enacted as a platform for global tobacco industry actors to avenue and advocate a common goal and its members have been among the major contributors to Indonesia's economy throughout the years. The Tobacco Working Group members regularly meet to exchange information and collaborate on the development of the sector's most recent policy frameworks. The Working Group had previously held a public hearing on the draft of the Minister of Finance Regulation on VAT on Tobacco Products.

In 2022, the Tobacco Working Group continued to evaluate current policy development and major topics for the sector, such as required policy support for the industry, harmonization of regulations in the tobacco industry, the tobacco industry road map, excise policy, and innovation development.

## ■ Transport & Logistics

The EuroCham Transport and Logistics Working Group brings together prominent multinational companies operating in Indonesia's transportation, logistics, freight-forwarding, express delivery services, shipping, and other relevant sub-sectors. Through the working group, EuroCham is able to foster positive communication between these businesses, decision-makers, and other stakeholders to create a favourable climate for investments.

The Working Group formulates suggestions for the appropriate policy makers as part of its advocacy activities, which are regularly coordinated among its member companies. In order to collectively address different policy developments in the sector in 2022, the Working Group communicated, among other stakeholders, with the Ministry of Finance, Directorate General of Tax, and Directorate General of Customs and Excise.

In 2022, the Working Group continued advocating various key topics for the sector including relaxation of foreign investment requirements, national logistics ecosystem, tax provisions for the sector, various customs procedures, import duty procedures under Free Trade Agreements, import of consigned goods, mandatory use of national shipping lines, road transportation safety, environmental sustainability development, as well as impact of the COVID-19 to Ocean Freight.




